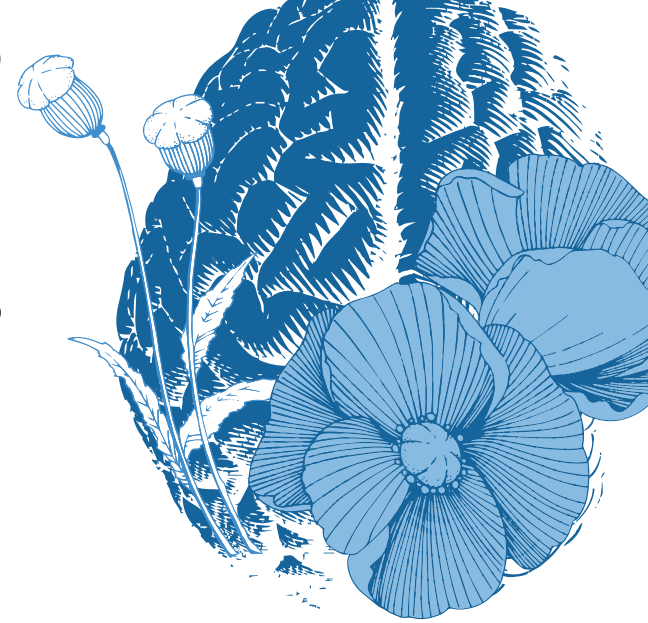


# AFMC's RESPONSE TO OPIOID CRISIS PROJECT

## NOW RECRUITING RESIDENTS AND PRACTICING PHYSICIANS TO TAKE PART IN SIMULATED CLINICAL INTERACTIONS WITH PATIENTS



With financial support from Health Canada, AFMC is developing a national curriculum for residents and practicing physicians to respond to the Opioid Crisis. The simulated clinical interactions will help provide hands-on experience for residents and practicing physicians to supplement current educational offerings on pain management, opioid stewardship and substance use disorder.

We are looking for residents and practicing physicians to take part in testing a Simulation Playbook containing 6 case-based scenarios related to patient care. The pilot will allow for the case-based scenarios to be tested and ensure that the simulation experience is realistic and educational.

### SIMULATION SCENARIOS:

Acute Chronic Pain & Opioid Use Disorder

Pediatric Pain

Opioid Tapering & Deprescribing

Diagnosing Opioid Use Disorder

Peripartum Management of Oral Opioid Agonist Treatment

Management of Opioid Side-Effects

### WHAT WILL BE REQUIRED?

Residents and practicing physicians will be asked to take part in up to **6 case-based scenarios** between April 1, 2022 and June 30, 2022

### HOW LONG WILL IT TAKE?

Time commitment from residents and practicing physicians is roughly 40 minutes per simulation scenario

### WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

Participation in piloting this Simulation Playbook has been certified for up to 6 MAINPRO+ credits for Family Medicine Specialists and accredited for up to 6 hours of MOC Simulation Program Section 3 credits for Royal College Specialists.

Participants will also receive a recognition letter for their time and commitment.
