Hand Hygiene Scenarios- Patient Menu Collection

- 1) You walk into a patient room to pick up the menu. A wheelchair is in the way. You decide that you need to move the wheelchair. What happens next?
 - a) Leave the room
 - b) Pick up the menu
 - c) Perform hand hygiene, move the wheelchair, perform hand hygiene again and then pick up the menu
 - d) None of the above

Rationale for answer:

Touching the wheelchair is considered an interruption in the sequential task. Once an interruption has occurred you must perform hand hygiene before continuing with the task.

2) List three more examples of interruptions in the sequential task:

Correct examples: shaking a patient's hand, picking something up off the floor for a patient, touching a curtain, moving a tray for the patient, handing a patient their pen/pencil, touching your own face, helping a patient with a menu

- 3) You come to a room with an additional precautions sign on the door. What do you do?
 - a) Leave that menu for the staff to place in the unit holder for pick-up
 - b) Perform hand hygiene and go in to get the menu
 - c) Put personal protective equipment on and go in to get the menu
 - d) Walk in and get the menu

Rationale for answer: Volunteers are not properly trained on additional precautions and donning (putting on) or doffing (taking off) personal protective equipment.

- 4) A curtain is drawn in a ward room. You've picked up all the other menus in the room. What do you do?
 - a) Ask the patient if you can come in to get their menu
 - b) Leave that menu for the staff to place in the unit holder for pick-up
 - c) Wash your hands, tell the patient to cover up, open the curtain and get the menu
 - d) Open the curtain and quickly grab the menu

Rationale for answer: Curtains are closed for a variety of reasons. We must respect the patient's privacy. If a curtain does get touched, that is considered an interruption in the sequential task and hand hygiene must be performed prior to continuing with menu pick-up.

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- 5) You are picking up menus and have finished one hallway. There is still another hallway to complete? What do you do?
 - a) Perform hand hygiene before moving onto the next hallway
 - b) Go right down the other hallway until menu pick-up is complete
 - c) Bring the menus you have to food services, go back up to finish the menu pick-up
 - d) None of the above

Rationale for answer: Performing hand hygiene between corridors/ hallways is a part of the sequential task description. It prevents any potential transmission of organisms from one area to another.

- 6) You have finished room menu pick-up on one floor and are ready to start room menu pick-up on another floor. When moving between floors/units during room menu pick-up what do you have to do first?
 - a) Remember what rooms did not get picked up from the unit folder and get them
 - b) Perform hand hygiene
 - c) Speak to the charge nurse about additional precautions
 - d) Nothing, just start menu pick-up

Rationale for answer: Performing hand hygiene between units/floors during room menu pick-up is a part of the sequential task description. It prevents any potential transmission of organisms from one area to another.
