

Getting Ready for Your MRI with Sedation

An MRI takes pictures of your body. The MRI machine is a large round camera and computer that can see your bones, organs and other parts of your body.



This is the waiting room.



You may wear hospital pajamas for your MRI.



An oximeter will measure the oxygen in your blood and the number of times your heart beats.



A blood pressure cuff will measure how fast your blood is moving through your body.



An IV (intravenous) is used to give your fluids and medicine.



A mask is used to give you “sleeping medicine” which is also called anesthetic.



It is time for your MRI! You will not feel, see or hear anything during your MRI.



After your MRI, you will move to the recovery area and then back to PMDU.
